Policy Statement

Medi-Nurse Panel Members will adhere to the prescribed professional dress code of Medi-Nurse, in accordance with the Regulations of the South African Nursing Council, at all times.

Standard

Step	Action
1	<p>Wear the prescribed uniform for females as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • White tunic tops available at MHR offices at subsidised rates • Northern region personnel may wear white blouses, but never the see-through type • Navy scrubs available at MHR offices at subsidised rates for panel members working in the critical care and trauma units of certain clients • Navy jersey/jacket in the winter season (to be removed when entering the department/hospital) • Navy skirt/slacks • Navy/black court/flat shoes. No clogs, crocks, sandals or slip-on's allowed • Skin colour stockings to be worn
2	<p>Wear the prescribed uniform for males as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • White tunic tops (available at MHR offices at a subsidised rate) or white shirt (Northern region only) • Navy scrubs available at MHR offices at subsidised rates for panel members working in the critical care and trauma units of certain clients • Navy jersey/jacket in the winter season (to be removed when entering the department/hospital) • Navy pants • Navy blue/black socks • Black shoes. No clogs, crocks, sandals or slip-on's allowed
3	Wear the distinguishing devices at all times according to the SANC regulations
4	Wear Medi-Nurse identification tag whilst on duty
5	Do not wear jewellery whilst on duty except a wedding band / engagement ring/stud earrings (one pair)
6	Keep hair neat and tidy
7	Keep nails short, clean and without nail polish
8	Men must be clean-shaven or neatly trimmed moustache/beard, depending on preference
